Ocean Governance

Ocean governance refers to long-term sustainable management of the world's oceans in order to ensure healthy and productive marine ecosystems, for the benefit of current and future generations.

Identify common transboundary issues related to ocean governance across the land-sea and other boundaries (i.e. multi-use)




Identify governance and stakeholder structures and tools needed to implement the Green Deal and climate policies in MSP

Community of Practice (CoP)



- The Community of Practice will bring together experts from governments, research institutions, NGOs and entrepreneurs in Ocean Governance to share knowledge, experience, ideas and to eventually realize Ocean Governance together (in practice).
- Applying the Community of Practice approach in the Ocean Governance learning strand includes the sharing and exploring of MSP challenges, solutions and best practices, in the context of ocean governance in order to raise the level of knowledge among the project partners and potentially for nations and sea basins elsewhere within the EU.
